The work consists of construction of a three story building for elderly housing with 90 apartments. The building is 5A protected construction over combustible а concrete foundation and slab-on-grade. The first floor is comprised of vestibule, common space, mailroom, community kitchen, laundry, lounge, lobby, office and 26, 1 and 2 bedroom apartments. The second floor is comprised of 32, 1 and 2 bedroom apartments, as is the third floor. Elevators provide accessibility to all floors. The project includes asphalt parking areas, concrete and asphalt walkways and other site amenities. This project received the Award of Merit-for the CBC Project Team Awards in 2019.

Award-Winning Project

The Chamberlain Heights Renovation project included the redevelopment of 126 units of affordable housing in 36 buildings over 22 acres. The result was a mix of 2, 3 and 4 -bedroom units ranging from 800 SF to 1100 SF and office space. This project also included repair and replacement of concrete walks throughout the development.

This project was a USGBC LEED® Certified project at the Gold Level.

LaRosa Building Group, LLC was awarded a CT-ABC Excellence in Construction Award, Award of Merit -Residential from the Associated Builders & Contractors of Connecticut for the Chamberlain Heights Renovation project.









The Hollander Foundation Center was a renovation and restoration to a 6.5-story historic building in Hartford, Connecticut. The old capitol building was renovated into 70-units of mixed-income rental housing as well as 13,000 SF ground floor commercial space.

This project is the first LEED® Certified Multifamily housing project in the state of Connecticut, the first LEED® Certified project to use historic tax credits, as well as the first affordable housing development in the downtown Hartford area. During the initial design of this project, the LEED® Silver level was the goal. During the construction, there were items performed that added extra points to submit for LEED® Gold level.









Award-Winning Project

This project was a new construction of a 60-unit supportive housing facility with a total of 61,119 SF. The construction is comprised of three wings, with the main entrance and common spaces in one area and residential units in the other two wings. Office, support, and community spaces are all located on the first floor near the entrance. Nine of the units are ADA accessible and 51 of them are ADA adaptable.

The building is composed of panelized, wood-framed construction and is a LEED® Silver Certified project.

Readiness Center at Camp Niantic

East Lyme, CT | Government

LaRosa Building Group provided general contractor services for this new, 50,000 SF administration and readiness training facility at Camp Niantic. The new center accommodates the law enforcement / legal detachment and the chemical battalion, and will also provide classrooms, administrative offices, storage, and various special functions. This project is a SPiRiT GOLD level sustainable/green project.

The project was built to provide the 192nd Military Police Battalion and the 85th Troop Command with modern office space for administrative functions and training duties.

The building is a new, steel-framed structure with a standing-seam metal roof and concrete foundation. The interior finishes for this project include a mixture of traditional drywall, floor coverings, and ceiling systems, as well as exposed concrete and steel.

This facility is a 5,400 SQ FT earth covered "Type-C" magazine, built to comply with the storage and handling requirements of MK-48 torpedoes. All of the material produced during the demolition of the existing magazines was sorted, processed, and crushed on site by LBG's staff, to specifications approved by the team's engineers. This allowed the reuse of 100% of this material as sub-base for remaining site work below roadways and aprons. This not only saved costs, but dramatically reduced the number of truck export / import trips neces-
